# Upcoming Program Attractions

## Technology Tuesdays!

*Clueless about your new tablet? Need to fill out an online job application, and don't know where to begin? Want to learn how to check out e-books from the library, and need help getting started? The Southside Branch of the Santa Fe Public Library is here to help with all of these computer questions and more with Technology Tuesdays, a series of free monthly computer workshops, designed to help beginning computer users in need of a little basic tech support.*

*Workshops will be on the second Tuesday of each month, January through April, at 10:00 a.m. in the Southside Branch Community Room. Each one hour workshop will begin with a 15-20 minute presentation on a specific computer or technology-related topic, followed by an open forum session to answer general computer questions and work through basic computer problems.*

*At the first session on January 14th, we'll start the New Year off right with a presentation on some technology trends for 2014, and focus on getting started with new devices acquired over the holidays. Participants are encouraged to bring their own laptop or tablet, and any computer questions they may have.*

## Kudos to Library Personnel and Members of the Friends

Therese Martinez, librarian assistant in Tech Services, is the New Mexico State Karate Alliance State Champion in three categories—weapons, form and sparring. Therese has been in martial arts for four years and has been competing for three years. She has placed in the top three consecutive years at the world level. She was the world champion in forms for the United States Karate Alliance in 2011-12 and was the United States national champion in weapons the same year.

The New Mexico Book Association recently announced its awards for the Richard Harris Memorial Honor celebrating the Great Literary City of Santa Fe.

Award honorees included the Santa Fe Public Library, Pat Hodapp, director; the Lannan Foundation Literary Program, Camille Lannan, manager; KSFR, Mary-Charlotte Domandi; NM State Library for the Blind and Physically Handicapped; Reading is Magic Camp, Perli Cunanan, director. Awardees spoke at the presentation and were awarded a hand-designed framed paper book.

Bernice Pearl, a volunteer at the Southside Library's Children's room was featured in the *Santa Fe New Mexican* for her astounding knitting skills and commitment to making caps for everyone. Her son challenged her to make 1,000 in a year and she did it in 2013! She is a gem, or rather a Pearl, beyond measure.
